# Using Docker Compose for Lightweight Container Management in Small to Medium-Sized Applications

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Abstract: By allowing you to define, configure and run several Docker containers with a single YAML file, Docker Compose simplifies container administration. By outlining key elements like services, networks, volumes, this file simplifies deployment, scaling and maintenance without the hassles of Docker Swarm or Kubernetes which can lead to more complicated system without need for that. Docker Compose can simplify the process of managing containers lifecycle, including starting, stopping and rebuilding services as necessary. By facilitating network isolation, environment variables, and service dependencies, it improves development and testing workflows and guarantees smooth container communication. Furthermore, Compose reduces operational overhead and does away with the need for extra orchestration tools by making it easier to manage multi-container setups on a single host. # Conversion of an obsolete debt into a natural obligation

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**Abstract:** The conversion of an obsolete debt into a natural obligation is a legal mechanism through which the duty to repay a debt, although no longer legally enforceable, may persist as a moral or voluntarily fulfillable obligation. This concept has a significant impact on contractual relationships, particularly in the fields of civil and commercial law.

The paper analyzes the legal nature of natural obligations, the conditions under which an obsolete debt may acquire this status, and its consequences for both the debtor and the creditor. The fundamental rule is that silence does not constitute acceptance of an offer, even if the offeror has stated in the offer that silence by the offeree will be interpreted as acceptance. Such clauses have no legal effect on the offeree and cannot impose any obligation on them. The conclusion of a contract by silence represents a special form of consent in contract law, where tacit behavior or failure to respond may be interpreted as acceptance of the offer. This is an exception to the general rule that acceptance, and thus the conclusion of a contract, cannot be expressed by silence. There are three exceptions when silence is interpreted as acceptance: when there is an ongoing business relationship between the offeror and the offeree concerning specific goods; when a person offers to carry out another's orders concerning the performance of specific transactions and is obliged to fulfill received orders unless they are immediately refused, and when the offeree is engaged in a business activity that involves fulfilling orders by its nature. In these cases, if the offeree receives the offer and remains silent, the silence will be deemed acceptance. If the offeree does not wish to accept, they must notify the offeror within the time normally required for acceptance.
